There are changes to the Warm Down arrangements at LAC this year, as we are unable to access the training pool. For the AM sessions, the main competition pool will be available for use for warm down for 15 minutes between the heats and finals. **Coaches must supervise their swimmers during this warm down period.**

From 1pm on Saturday and from 2pm on Sunday, the diving pool will be available for use as warm down for the afternoon sessions. **Before this time, competitors should not use the diving pool as it is unavailable to us.**

### Withdrawals

Clubs should withdraw swimmers via the QR codes provided by Lynn Gates. Clubs are reminded that where a swimmer does not swim and has not been withdrawn that a £20 fine will apply. Withdrawals can be made up until the start of warm up.

If you are owed a refund for a medical withdrawal, these will be processed after the conclusion of the Championships through your club gala secretary.

### Certificates of Exemption

Swimmers and/or Team Managers must present any exemption certificates to the referee before the start of the race, and ideally before the start of the session.



If a swimmer has any other needs or conditions that may affect them before, during or after a race, that is not covered by an exemption certificate, it is advisable that this is brought to the attention of the referee before the start of the race, including taping.

## Medals, Presentation and Trophies

The medals table will be on the balcony between the spectator and swimmer galleries. Trophies will also be presented on that balcony. This will allow parents the opportunity to take photographs of their swimmers with their medals etc. Because of time constraints there will not be formal presentations. Please be aware that in order to claim your trophy from your event, you will need to sign a claim form as you will be responsible for it. Further information can be found here.

## Safeguarding

**From Chelsey Denney, the Kent County Welfare Officer:**

Please read the attached document very carefully. As noted within it:

One such pass covers that individual for all the KCASA competitive swimming Meets/sessions for the year (e.g. the LAC sessions, the K2 Crawley sessions, the Kent County Team Championships and the Kent Junior Meet) and therefore should be retained. Passes are £15.

## Spectator Information

Spectator tickets for all sessions are now available for purchase. Tickets for the LAC sessions are priced at £6.50 per session. Please note that you may be subject to a bag search on entry to the LAC.

There are no cash sales on the door – all tickets must be bought online through the link above. Please ensure you have saved or screenshotted your confirmation email to enable us to get people seated on poolside as quickly as possible.

Access to the building is on the West Ham side of the LAC, using the door nearest the gym. **This is the only entrance this year. Spectators are asked to queue from the entrance towards the bridge, with all other attendees queuing the opposite way.**


West Ham United have a home game at 12:30, so the normal home game closures and crowd management will apply.

Access through Westfield is likely to be restricted from 9:30 and until 15:30, so please allow extra time to arrive to the LAC, particularly if you are coming to Session 3 (24<sup>th</sup> January PM).

The 'No Food' policy at LAC preventing bringing in food from outside remains in force except for the swimmers and coaches/team managers who may bring in their own food. Bags will be checked at the entry point by security staff. There is a café by the reception area. Past experience has shown that queues can be long and slow moving especially during the break so please be patient. This is totally outside the control of the County. The pod in the upstairs galleries will be open so please try and use this as much as possible.

## Parking

**We suggest you park in one of the Westfield car parks which is much cheaper than the LAC car park.**





If you intend to park in the car park at the Aquatics Centre you must register your vehicle in reception on the ground floor on arrival (it is the touch pad on the pools side of the reception desk).

If you do this you will get the member's car parking rate. You must still enter your registration number before leaving in the machine which is in the car park towards the entrance and exit to the car park and make payment there.

If you do not register your vehicle at reception you will be charged at the full rate which is understood to be in the region of £45 per day. If you fail to pay at all you will receive a penalty notice in the minimum sum of £60.

### Weekend 2 (31<sup>st</sup> January/1<sup>st</sup> February) Information

**Saturday 31<sup>st</sup> January - immediately after the end of Session 6 – Presentation to the National County Team Championship winning team** (Behind blocks at Diving Pit end of the Pool – see below)

As many will be aware the County Team won the National County Team Championships in Sheffield last October for the third time in 4 years. This is an amazing achievement by Kent swimmers and coaches as we are a County without the use of Long Course facilities in our own County and we were up against many Counties who have the benefit of not only a number of long course facilities but also of attracting swimmers from around the Country and beyond to the dedicated Swimming Schools within their Counties. We will be making a presentation to the Team immediately before the start of the afternoon session on Saturday 31<sup>st</sup> January. Please could those clubs with swimmers in the team please advise their swimmers – attendance is not obligatory but it would be good to have as many there as possible.

**Sunday 1<sup>st</sup> February - as soon as possible after the end of Session 8 - 12 Year Old Development Pathway Parents Talk** (In the Creche, by the ground floor main reception area – see below)

All parents of swimmers aged 12 at the end of this year (i.e. born in 2014) are encouraged to join us for a brief introductory talk on the Swim England 12 Year Development Programme which is administered by the County. This will be given by Gary Inch of Greenwich Royals who will be the lead coach for the programme. The talk will be at approximately 1300 on Sunday (or as soon as swimming finishes on Sunday morning). It will take place in the Creche at LAC which is by the main reception area on the lower level. There will be limited seating for those less able to stand but the session should not last more than half an hour. Please also note that as space is limited it is preferred that only one parent per swimmer attends.
